Challenge

Celebrate

Celebrate life's success and God's provision. Worship God's presence. Time to brag about God. - Ask: What has God done in our life that deserves praise?

rayer & Praise. This weeks sermon helped us to focus on God as the creator of the universe. Pastors Shannon Kane helped us to look at the awesomeness of the God who holds everything together.
