Bible Passages

Ephesians 5:21-33

21submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Wives and Husbands

²²Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. ²³For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. ²⁴Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands.

25Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, 26that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, 27so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish.^a 28In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. 29For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, 30because we are members of his body. 31"Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." 32This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church. 33However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

Connect:

Challenge:

Dive into God's Word. Use these discussion questions. Learn from each other's insight.

2. Are there any other desires that you would also like to see included in your life mission? (For example: purchasing a home, starting a business, starting a small group, etc.)

3. Start building your mission statement by incorporating the above areas (from #1 and #2) into a mission paragraph. (See example.)

"To love and to serve God; to love and to complement one another in order to see the purposes of God fulfilled in our spouse's life; to raise our children in the truth of God's Word - equipping them to live godly lives; to be out of debt; to be people helpers in the body of Christ - be it through worship, leading a small group, reaching out neighbors, etc.; to be an active testimony and witness to the world."

4. What goals can you develop (in writing) that will move you toward your mission statement? List at least one.

5. What are some action points you (and your spouse) can take to meet these goals? List at least one.

Clarify:

Does anyone need clarity on something? Are there any big God questions you are wrestling with?

Celebrate:

Celebrate life's successes and God's provision. Worship God's presence. Time to brag about God.
